The Pelontaran 5 June 2005

After the course finished, I gave Mohammad Pak Sudi's handphone number and advised him to look Pak Sudi up. That, he did. I met him by chance in Kuta - coincidentally, just the day before, he was eating at the same restaurant I was eating at. I saw him passing the restaurant and I called out after him. I then shifted to his hotel, and met up with Pak Sudi again.

Pak Sudi brought us to his group practice at Petitenget Temple. He has a large group of students. Pak Sudi was so hospitable and kind. He is a very open teacher. He allowed us to join his group practice, and at the end, he called us up for pelontaran. Wow! He must have read our thoughts and deeply felt desire to be tested. At least I really and truly wanted the pelontaran.

Mohammad was first to be tested. He was instructed to sit down cross-legged on the beach, and concentrated on Gajah Madah. Then a whole lot of attackers charged at him and fell over. That was awesome! Then it was my turn. I could understand Pak Sudi encouraging his students not to be afraid and to have faith in the deities that they will be alright if they attack me. He said I would be using Gajah Madah. But I am more familiar with Brahma Gni, so I used that instead, and did not tell anybody. The attackers charged and they fell.
